Directions:

- 1. Head south past the Capitol Building.
- 2. Turn right on Gaines St.
- 3. Turn left on Railroad Ave.
- 4. Turn right into Railroad Square just after the tracks and before you see FAMU.
- 5. Drive to the back of Railroad Square. This street at the back is Commercial St.
- Keith's studio is the second to last studio on the right end of the building – #1006.

This is another in our series of field trips to artists' studios(generally our May meetings but moved to July this year). It is instructive to see the way artists organize their environments and thus their work process.

Born in Boston, Keith was raised and educated principally in New England and Europe. He majored in art at Yale and then spent several years studying at The Art Students League of New York. He moved to Florida in the mid sixties and has been in the Tallahassee area for about 11 years. He has taught at the Lemoyne Center For Visual Arts approximately ten years.

Keith writes in his Artist's Statement, "I do get caught up in the joy and discoveries of manipulating my oil paint, this wonderful thick viscous media that can make so many different kinds of marks. To me it is always a miracle to see how a mark on a surface can somehow assume a dual role: first as a descriptive note within the pictorial space, and secondly, as textural presence of the artist. There is always a play between using the mark as abstract element and using it as a descriptive tool."

During the field trip, Keith will give a short talk about his work . Soft drinks and water

will be available.
