Program 7:50 - 9:00 pm *Analyzing African Art*


Speaker: Matt Scheiner

Africa is an immense continent, more than three times the size of Europe. It is home to a multitude of diverse cultures with rich histories and artistic traditions. In the absence of written language, art has been paramount for the practice of complex spiritual and ritual traditions, for the conveyance of knowledge and histories,

and for marking the identities of cultures and subcultures. The artistic traditions of sub-Saharan Africa are not well studied compared to the art from other parts of the world, and are frequently misunderstood. This is despite the undisputed influence of traditional African art on Western modern art. And, while top quality traditional African Art pieces are now selling for millions of dollars, the genre of traditional African art is mired by a marketplace filled with misrepresented copies and counterfeits that further confuse understanding and appreciation. Matt Scheiner, collector and expert in the traditional arts of sub-Saharan Africa will discuss these topics through the presentation of selected objects from the MoFA permanent collection and from his personal collection.

Matthew Scheiner is a "home-schooled" expert in the traditional arts of Sub-Saharan Africa. His experience in the field spans more than 40 years during which he has been a scholar, collector, curator, dealer, and author. As a scholar, he has amassed a personal library of more than 350 books, periodicals and catalogs on African Art history, collections, appreciation, as well as African culture and ethnology. He has visited and studied most

major museum collections across Europe and the United States. As a collector and dealer, in partnership with his wife, more than 1300 objects have passed through his collection. As a curator, he has presented approximately 20 exhibitions in galleries at academic institutions and at the private Gallery Jatad in Houston, TX. As an author, he has written catalogs for exhibitions, essays for periodicals, and is currently working on a book focusing on the figurative traditional arts of Mali. Matthew Scheiner moved to Tallahassee from Houston in February of 2017 with his wife, artist Lisa Qualls, a member of the Artists' League.



"Have you ever worked in an office? ... The group assembles in the conference room and the boss goes over what assignments each team member is responsible for in the coming week. [A]n assistant prepares a work sheet and distributes it. When this hits your desk an hour later, you know exactly what you have to do that week.

I have one of those meetings with myself every Monday. I sit down and go over my assignments. Then I type [them] up and distribute [them] to myself. I have corporate stationery[,]...business cards[,] and ... checkbook. I write off corporate expenses and pay corporate taxes. I have different credit cards for myself and my corporation.

If we think of ourselves as a corporation ... [w]e're less subjective. We don't take blows as personally. We're more cold-blooded; we can price our wares more realistically. Sometimes, as Joe Blow himself, I'm too mild-mannered to go out and sell. But as Joe Blow, Inc., ... I'm not me anymore. I'm Me, Inc. I'm a pro."


