This "top-of-the-Capitol" show is the third such exhibition coordinated for the FSU MoFA Artists' League by long time member Terrie Corbett in coordination with the Division of Cultural Affairs. Previous exhibitions were mounted in 2003 and 2015. The League wishes to express much gratitude to Terrie. Coordinating an exhibition of this caliber takes several years to develop and implement. As an artist, she herself works in multiple media, kiln-fired glass, encaustic, and enamel.



The *Way We See It!* includes 65 pieces by 35 League artists. The media is diverse, inclusive of fine art and fine craft, an apt representation of the League to the Florida public. Work shown on the dramatic 22nd Floor of the Capitol Building gives League artists greater exposure since it is often viewed by Floridians and others who travel to Tallahassee for business and as tourists.
