Exhibition card and poster design by Bill Humphries. First, Second, Honorable Mention and new award given, Emerging Artist, as well as new Jurors Commendations in all media categories. Also dollar amount of awards increased: 1st -\$300; 2nd - \$150, Hon Mention and Emerging Artist - gift certificates for art supplies worth \$50 each. Mayor's Choice Award given for the first time. At least one sale from the exhibition. Highest participation - 67 artists.

Of Vision and Variety*, Sept, Oct, Nov 2015 with over 40 members participating, an effort that took several years to develop and mount; Walk and Talk meeting in the exhibition took place October 13 (Chair: Terrie Corbett); at the Black Dog Café, exhibition titled *Viewer Discretion Advised*, 11 members participated, \$25 vouchers awarded to two artists by Black Dog Café who deemed Jennifer Clinard's work the best of the show (Chair: Marie Thompson); & Walmsley Gallery – see #6. 5. Continuation of a viable Artists' League Account – used for special events, supplies when needed, to send cards to members when appropriate (original artist cards for needed occasions/reasons), to offer awards at the Summer Annual, etc. (Co-Chairs: Jaye Houle and Mary Liz Moody).

6. Continuation of a number of mini-organizations or mini-guilds within the membership, based on shared interest among the members of miniguilds. Three guilds continue: Paper Guild, Sketch Crawlers Guild, Digital Artists Guild. The League maintains special connections with the Southern Art Glass Alliance.
